

# Ripple Mapping: Documenting Meaningful Change



#### **Process Observations:**

- **Easy to grasp**: Ripples are a common experience to frame the process
- Self-regulating: Community vets each suggestion in real time
- Inclusive: Process allows for 100% participation regardless of education or literacy




