B) a new \$10M facility built out over two years (\$7M in FY 2010 and \$3M in FY 2011), would count as a \$3M capital expenditure in FY 2011. C) a new \$4.5M laboratory, designed by a design and build firm in Ohio for \$3.5 M with a single piece of German laboratory equipment for \$500K and the rest of the lab equipment from in-state vendors would count as \$3.5M in "out-of-region" new construction, \$0.5M "out-of-region" new equipment purchases and \$0.5M in "in-state" new equipment purchases.
